- At least one course must meet the Human Diversity (HD) requirement. This is a graduation requirement for CCC.
- At CCC, choose a (G) Global Diversity and a (U) US Diversity course from recommended list to meet IWU graduation requirements. **Global diversity options:** ANTHRO 202, HIST 215, HIST 212, 247, HUM 215, MUS 183, POL SCI 204, SOC 210, SPANISH 104. **US Diversity options:** HIST 111, 112, 114, 115, 216, HUM 107, POL SCI 201, SOC 207.
- Other City Colleges history courses may be appropriate for the IWU major. In total, ten courses will be required for the major, and no more than six of those courses may be focused on a single geographic region such as the US or Europe. At least five of the ten major courses must be completed at IWU.

Work with your IWU advisor to select major courses. No more than six courses in the major may be focused on a single geographic region (eg. US, Europe)

- Students should follow the Associates in Arts degree at CCC as opposed to the Associates in Science degree. The AA degree includes the Gen Ed Certificate, which is a complete package of transferable General Education Core Courses (GECC).
- AP scores of 3, 4 and 5 will receive 1 unit of credit. Standard level IB scores of 5 or higher will receive 1 unit of credit.
- Remedial math courses may be needed to prepare for the math requirement. However, remedial courses will not transfer to IWU. Adjust schedule and hour requirements accordingly to complete degree.
- The IWU Second Language requirement can be met by completing the intermediate level (XXXXX-103) course of any language or by earning a 4 or 5 on the AP exam in a second language. Visit the IWU website for information: <https://www.iwu.edu/registrar/transfer-credit-faq.html>
- Students should complete a minimum of 64 semester hours, not including remedial or Physical Education courses, at City Colleges of Chicago to be on track to complete their bachelor's degree in a total of four years.
- Students are required, at minimum, to complete 16 units of coursework at IWU including half of all major requirements.
- IWU Graduation requirements: 32 total courses and 32 total units with 9 courses and 9 units of upper-level courses. (1 IWU unit = 4 semester hours)
